The Kings scored a very high Commendation – just one point short of a distinction - so were very pleased by the culmination of their recent hard work that had got to this standard. Renowned Vocal Coach Visits Harpenden!

Thursday 2nd February saw the renowned vocal coach Linda Corcoran putting the Kings of Herts through their paces.

Since 2000, she has been the front-line director of The Great Western Chorus of Bristol, the most successful Men's barbershop chorus in UK history having won the British Championship a record 10 times. Linda led the chorus to the 4 of those Gold Medals and has 3 times, taken the chorus to the World Championships in the USA. She holds 2 national Quartet Gold Medals, the first singing Tenor with the 1994 Champions Checkmate and then in 2007, as the Lead in Havoc.

After only one hour of practicing vowel sounds and sustaining pitch from Linda, a video of our improvement was there for all to see! You can view it on our facebook site. It is fully intended that future educational evenings like this will be organised.




New Year's Resolutions Anyone?
